### Required Materials

**\*\* Students are not permitted to go to their lockers once class begins to get any of these items! \*\***

- 3 Ring Binder(s): This should be at least 2" thick as I enjoy giving many handouts.

I will leave the organization system up to the student. One student might prefer to keep items chronological, whereas another student might create separate sections for notes, homework, handouts, and the like.

Some past students have kept an additional 3 Ring Binder at home with material from previous units so that their school binder is easier to manage.

- Pencils and erasers
- Calculator (scientific or a graphing calculator - preferably any variety of Ti-83 or Ti-84 or Ti-NSpire)  
I recommend the graphing calculators - especially for future courses. The Ti-83, Ti-84, and Ti-NSpire (NON-CAS) models will be permitted in any math class at CHS, and they are also allowed on the ACT and SAT. If you have specific questions about what type of calculator you should purchase, please contact me. As a note, the graphing calculator will be used in the following courses as well: Advanced Algebra 2, Advanced Precalculus, AP Calculus (or the college prep versions of these), Chemistry I, Chemistry II, Honors Chemistry, Physics, and Honors Physics.
- Textbook (you should keep this covered, but you do not need to bring it to class daily)
- Compass
- Protractor
- Ruler
- Highlighters or Colored Pencils (suggested especially if you are a student that finds color-coordination helpful)

### Discipline Policy

This is the general procedure used for deviations from expected behavior in class. Obviously, extreme situations will be handled appropriately. (*Hopefully we do not have to use this much.*)

- Step 1:* Acknowledge misbehavior informally and warn student.  
*Step 2:* Talk to student individually and see if a solution can be reached.  
*Step 3:* Give the student a detention.  
*Step 4:* Notify the parents / guardians.  
*Step 5:* Send the student to an assistant principal. (Notify parent / guardian.)  
*Step 6:* Conduct a meeting with the parents or guardians, administrator, and teacher.
