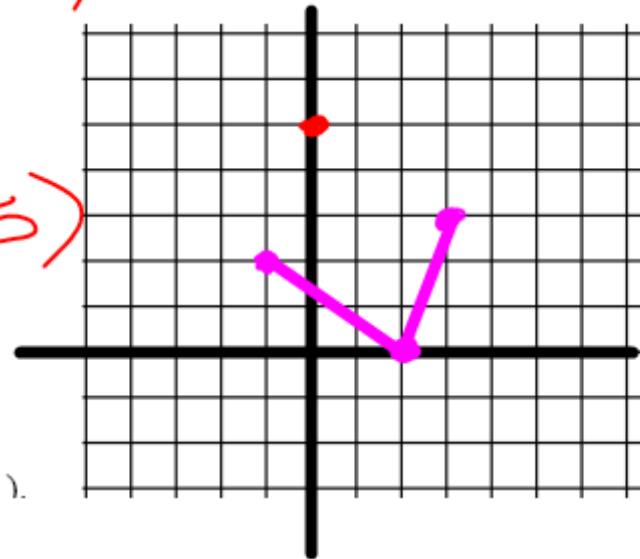
- 1.) Three points of a parallelogram are $(-1,2)$, $(3,3)$, and $(2,0)$.
